

## EXPLANATION OF THE COMPETITION TERMS AND CONDITIONS NO. 22

Správa železnic, státní organizace, with its registered office at Dlážděná 1003/7, Prague 1, Postcode 110 00, Czech Republic, ID No.: 709 94 234 (the "**Contracting Authority**"), commenced a procurement procedure regarding the design competition entitled "**Správa železnic Headquarters**", published in the Tenders Electronic Journal under registration no. Z2020-034118 (the "**Competition**"). The Competition has been announced as an open design competition pursuant to Section 145 of Act No. 134/2016 Sb., on Public Procurement, as amended (the "**PPA**").

The Contracting Authority has received a written request for explanation of the Competition Terms and Conditions pursuant to Section 144(2) of the PPA from a prospective participant interested in participating in the Competition. The Contracting Authority hereby provides an explanation of the Competition Terms and Conditions in both Czech and English languages including the exact wording of the request for explanation of the Competition Terms and Conditions, without identification details of the prospective participant who has requested the explanation.

	<b><i>Request of the participant where the explanation was provided based on a request for explanation</i></b>	<b><i>Explanation of the Contracting Authority</i></b>
<b>1.</b>	<p><i>Original request:</i></p> <p>I would like to address another question regarding the "Recommended Shed Area" at land B for further clarification (please see the attached screenshots):</p> <p>From document P06.1_Regulation it is not very clear the following: Does the recommended shed area at land B can entirely covered with canopy roof and only one third of that area can be enclosed at ground floor or only one third of that area can be covered with canopy roof and enclosed at ground roof?</p>	<p>The whole marked area can be roofed and one third of that area can be enclosed at the ground floor level. The regulation under this point is recommended only.</p>
<b>2.</b>	<p><i>Translation of the request:</i></p> <p>Thank you for your answers but we must apologize and ask the question once again as by mistake we formulated the question conversely.</p> <p>The question concerned the possibility of making a bridge between buildings A and B on the same grounds as are those permitted by the regulation for a bridge between buildings B and C.</p> <p>Therefore, please answer our questions formulated as follows:</p>	<p>In accordance with P06_Regulation the connection between buildings "A" and "B" was assumed at the 1<sup>st</sup> above-ground floor level only so that the view axis between the blocks is not interfered with. The regulation under this point is recommended only.</p> <p>In general, an interconnection by means of suspended elements with visual permeability is possible.</p>

	<p>1/ Is it possible at higher elevated floors to interconnect buildings A and B via a closed bridge with an internal corridor?</p> <p>2/ Is it possible to visually interconnect buildings and A and B and C by means of suspended elements (such as facade sheets) which will not at the same time block the visual permeability defined by the masses of all three buildings within their defined limits, i.e. within the width of the streets connected to it?</p>	
<p><b>3.</b></p>	<p><i>Original request:</i></p> <p>We have been looking at contracting documents, and in P15.1_SAMPLE_CESTNE_PROHLASENI_UCASTNIKA_EN it requests us to provide a structural engineering entity with its experience.</p> <p>Question: in order to implement this project, there would be more consultants than just a structural engineer consultant as requested to fill in, so do we have to fill in our structural consultant for this submission or we could wait until shortlisted to provide a list of technical consultants that we want to participate with us as a big team.</p>	<p>The Contracting Authority is aware of the fact that a Competition participant will engage their whole implementation team in the preparation of the competition entry and if shortlisted also in the performance of the Ensuing Contract.</p> <p>However, the Contracting Authority would like to make it clear that in the document P15.1_SAMPLE_CESTNE_PROHLASENI_UCASTNIKA_EN (an affidavit on compliance with the conditions for participation) the participant will state only <b><u>names and surnames of the following 2 natural persons (individuals):</u></b></p> <p>1) Architect</p> <p>= an individual meeting the conditions for participation in the Competition as per clause 4.1.1 (e)(1) of the Competition Terms and Conditions</p> <p>(to be inserted in the table on page 6 of document P15.1)</p> <p>2) Building structure designer</p> <p>= an individual meeting the conditions for participation in the Competition as per clause 4.1.1 (e)(2) of the Competition Terms and Conditions</p> <p>(to be inserted in the table on pages 7 and 8 of document P15.1)</p>

		This means that in P15.1 the participant will state only details of the two above-referenced members of the implementation team.
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**For the avoidance of any doubts, the Contracting Authority states that the provision of explanations above does not constitute a change in the Competition Terms and Conditions within the meaning of Sections 98(5) and 99 of the Public Procurement Act.**

**The Contracting Authority would like to point out to the supplier (prospective participants) that pursuant to clause 5.3.1. of the Competition Terms and Conditions, they may submit requests for explanation of the Competition Terms and Conditions only in writing, no later than 17 days before the lapse of the deadline for the submission of a competition entry, i.e. by 25 January 2021 12:00 p.m.**

The Contracting Authority recommends suppliers who have any requests for explanation to make use of the above period and submit the requests to the Contracting Authority on time. After the expiry of the deadline, the Contracting Authority will not be accepting any requests for explanations of the Competition Terms and Conditions submitted by suppliers.

**The Contracting Authority reminds that the current time limit for submitting competition entries has been set until 12 February 2021, 5:00 p.m. CET (Central European Time).**
